TEACHERS' WORKSHOP

The Boyell Cancer Diabetes Foundation hosted its first-of-a-kind workshop for teachers on 28th & 29th April, 2016 at the Works Conference Room, Shaw Park, Tobago. The topic: "Diabetes Prevention, Recognition and Oversight at School: What Teachers Need to Know" targeted Tobago's primary school teachers. The ultimate aim of this project is to improve both health and learning for students with, or at high risk for diabetes by providing diabetes training for school teachers and staff. **Rationale:** Diabetes is a major public health problem in Trinidad and Tobago. In Tobago, full time healthcare service is unavailable at most primary schools. BCDF believes that training workshops designed to address school teachers, principals and other staff may be one of the most practical ways to impact on early diabetes prevention, management and lifestyle intervention efforts among our young children and their parents.

The Situation

- **♣** There is a high prevalence of diabetes in Tobago, where almost every family has one or more members with a history of diabetes
- ♣ Between 2009 and 2015, Bovell Cancer Diabetes Foundation (BCDF) recorded high rates of obesity among elementary school children attending its annual Diabetes in the Limelight Jamboree
- Between 2009 to 2015, BCDF have been informally assessing the diabetes knowledge among primary school teachers. Our findings revealed that primary school teachers in Tobago need to become more aware of the nature and elements of diabetes in order to better serve their student population.
- **Parents have given us many instances** where their children's diabetes problems (such as hypo- and hyperglycemia) have been often labelled as 'laziness and tricks to get away from doing the class work'.

The Outcomes

Twenty six of Tobago's 33 primary schools and one Early Childhood Centre participated in the workshop (Table 1). Most of the participating schools sent the two requested teachers, giving us a total of 39 teachers. The workshop was declared open by Dr. Verlyn Bobb-Lewis, filling in for Mr. Huev Cadette, Secretary, Division of Education, Youth Affairs and Sport. The Division of Health and Social Services (DHSS) was represented by Assemblyman Sheldon Cunningham, Assistant Secretary, DHSS, who gave a very relevant, encouraging, practical and well-received address to the teachers. The six major learning outcomes, articulated at the beginning of the workshop were accomplished. The workshop consisted Table 1. List of participating schools

of nine units. It began with an introduction

It began with an introduction to the Workshop; Unit 1: Diabetes Primer for School Teachers; Unit 2: Diabetes in Children and Adolescents; Unit 3: Nutrition, Physical Activity and Lifestyle Basics; Unit 4: Actions for school teachers, other staff, parents/guardian, students; Unit 5: Tools; Unit 6: School Health Responsibilities; Unit 7: Sustainable and Follow-up Actions and Evaluation; Unit 8: Resources and Glossary of Diabetes Terms; Unit 9: Faculty, staff, list of participants and follow-up actions. Faculty/Staff consisted of a Medical Doctor, Nutritionist, two Diabetes Educators, four volunteer Assistants and a Photographer.

Samples of the outcomes of Unit 2 and a picture gallery follow.

Practicum for Unit 2: Module 4 Diabetes in **Children** – "What Teachers Should Know." The session was facilitated by Rosetta Bovell, Diabetes Educator. Report for the practicum session (Group activity) - 'Some creative ways to get our parents to share more, to be more open.' Teachers were divided into groups of four/five based on seating. The groups were numbered and instructed to discuss and document (in point format), creative ways to include parents in diabetes prevention and management of their children. It was stated that many of the traditional methods have not been giving the desired results. Posters were distributed to record points for sharing with whole workshop in a small presentation at the end of the session. Each school was encouraged to try at least two methods from the recorded suggestions. The work groups brought back the following points/answers to the exercise:

- A. Schools should aim to cultivate a collaborative approach:
 - i. Establish confidentiality among staff with any data
 - ii. Be aware of teacher's tone and approach to parents. Be sensitive in communications
- iii. Help parents to feel a sense of ownership by involvement in class and school activities.
- iv. Encourage trust and cordiality in the Parent Teachers' Association (PTA)
- v. Adopt a policy of equality\fairness for all students
- B. Schools should build on parents and teachers' relationships and strengthen communication:
 - i. Be private and confidential with meetings, e.g. create an area where discussions\conferences can be held;
 - ii. Reassure parents of extra support if necessary, like helping us to help you;
- iii. Develop open relationships with an open door\classroom policy;
- iv. Encourage a relationship with the home/family to home visits where

- where possible;
- v. Teacher tries to make him/herself accessible;
- vi. Include parent story/drama time in the classroom. Some stories should have a diabetes focus.
- C. Schools should raise awareness of diabetes through education:
 - i. Teacher should seek knowledge and educate self on diabetes;
 - ii. Sensitize the PTA through class meetings and one on one discussions;
- iii. Plan and host diabetes awareness activities, seeking and using professionals, for example:
 - school health fair, lifestyle management discussion, health open day - having different booths, designing diabetes care charts for display, using parental questionnaire, distributing pamphlets, having a health promotion week


