Access to Self-Monitoring

- Blood glucose monitoring is a fundamental component of diabetes care
- Many people with diabetes do not have access to the equipment and supplies they need. IF NOT NOW, WHEN?

Access to Education & Psychological Support

- People living with diabetes need ongoing education to manage their condition
- Many do not have access to diabetes education. IF NOT NOW, WHEN?

<u>Trinidad and Tobago – Diabetes Quick Facts</u> for 2019

- 1 in 8 adults (20 79 years) have diabetes
- Number of adults 20 79 years with diabetes in 1,000s 121.3 (121,300)
- Diabetes prevalence in adults 20 79 years 12.3%
- 167 children and adolescents 0 − 19 years have Type 1 diabetes
- In 2019, there were 1,191 diabetes-related deaths in adults 20 79
- 30% of adults 20 79 years have undiagnosed diabetes. Undiagnosed are at further risk of complication
- The cost per person with diabetes (20 79 years) is roughly TT8,400.0 or US\$1,200.00/year.

COMPETITION DESCRIPTION

The Bovell Cancer Diabetes Foundation announces the 12th annual poster competition among school children to help raise awareness and educate about the seriousness of diabetes and its complications, the importance of improving access to diabetes care, and highlight the need for more action to prevent diabetes and its complications. All the submissions – whether humorous, serious, figurative or abstract, drawing or otherwise should transmit an important message that reflects some aspect of "ACCESS TO DIABETES CARE" (2021 World Diabetes Day Theme) and/or Tagline "IF NOT NOW, WHEN ?"

ELIGIBILITY

Any child between the ages of 6 and 15 years is eligible to participate.

Two age groups : 6-9 years; 10-15 years

HOW TO ENTER

- Each entry form must be signed by a teacher / principal / parent / quardian
- 2. There may be no more than one poster entry from each student; individual entries only!
- 3. Posters must have the category you are competing under (Drawing, Colourful or Open)
- Each poster must have a <u>title</u> and must address "Access to Diabetes Care" (the 2021 focus).
- Keep it simple To submit your poster digitally take a photo or scan your poster and send to us by email or WhatsApp. Be sure to keep the original, it will be needed if you win the contest

JUDGING PROCESS

- Posters must focus on "Access to Diabetes Care/ If Not Now, When?"
- 2. Appearance: attractively displayed in colour
- 3. Demonstrate effective use of art materials
- 4. Original design or innovative concept
- 5. Adhere to the rules of the competition
- 6. Be suitable for reproduction
- 8. Winners will be announced 6th November, 2021 at the 13th "Diabetes in the Limelight Jamboree",





Write and perform your 3-minute monologue on video expanding the topic "Access to Diabetes Care" with tagline "If Not Now, When?" to compete for TT\$1,000 /USD 150+ BCDF Monologue Champion 2021 Title

Video Monologue Contest 2021 - Rules and Guidelines

The Guidelines for this Contest are as follows:

- ♦ All monologues must be **limited to a maximum of three minutes in length.**
- ♦ Videos which exceed this limit will not be eligible for consideration as finalists.
- The monologue must be prepared by the student
- Effective Monologues will address the theme "Access to Diabetes Care" and/or "If Not Now, When?"
- No costumes. Students should dress in a manner appropriate for their presentations, and preferably use the **light blue colour**, which is the universal colour for diabetes.
- Simple set pieces such as a table and chair could be used in the monologue. No additional set pieces will be permitted.
- Creativity and artistic risk-taking are encouraged, although students are encouraged to choose material judiciously. Monologue material should be suitable for people of all ages. If the judges deem material to be salacious or inappropriate, students may be ineligible for consideration.
- Winners will be chosen by a panel of judges. All judges' decisions are final.
- Student with the highest scores will be recognized at the 13th Annual Diabetes in the Limelight Jamboree on 6th November 2021 and will be deemed "BCDF Monologue Champion 2021"

♦ Entry into the Video Monologue Contest gives BCDF the right to use the pictorial likenesses and/or biographical information of the contestants for publicity purposes as deemed fit by the BCDF at no cost of recompense to any party.

Each contestant MUST:

- 1. Be a registered student in any secondary/high school
- 2. Complete and submit an entry form (title/registration screen on video) signed by a teacher, parent, or guardian if you are less than 18 years. Deadline for application entry is 27th

 October 2021.
- 3. All entries must be digital videos.
- 4. The length of the video should not exceed three minutes, not including the 10 second title / registration screen.
- 5. All entries should begin with a 10 second full screen "title / registration screen" that includes the following information:
 - a. Student's name
 - **b.** Student's Age
 - c. Student's Email
 - **d.** School name and country
 - e. Title of video
 - **f.** Total running time (not including the 10 second title screen)
- 6. Students will present their monologues on video and submit the video to bovellcancerdiabetesfoundation@gmail.com or WhatsApp 334) 590-3073
- 7. <u>Videos could be submitted via Google Drive (remember to share) or uploaded to You Tube</u> and link sent
